Review the Bible truths from this lesson by covering the following:

- Jesus was God Incarnate. He became man and lived on the earth.
- . God Incarnate means God in the flesh.
- The Person of the Trinity that the Bible refers to as the Word is Jesus.
- Jesus is the all-powerful God and Creator of the universe. But He was able to empathize with all people because He was born as a human baby and experienced life on Earth as a man.
- Jesus came to Earth as a selfless man to show people who God is and how to live as followers of God, and to provide the means of salvation.
- . God laid aside His glory to submit to being in a physical body.
- Jesus experienced many feelings and emotions as a selfless man: anger, happiness, joy, tiredness, grief, dread, compassion. But since He did not sin, He would not ever have felt hatred or jealousy toward another person. It is important to know that Jesus can empathize with people. Jesus, as the High Priest, understands the difficulties that people face. He knows what it is like to live with the weaknesses of a body of flesh.
- Everyone is an example to someone, whether a good or bad one.
- Jesus was the greatest example of selfless servanthood.

A person's response to difficult situations is partly determined by whether they follow Jesus' example.

- Jesus forgave those who mocked Him at the cross.
- In tempting Jesus, Satan was trying to cause Jesus to sin so that He would no longer be a blameless sacrifice.
- Jesus was submissive to God's plan, not giving in to Satan's temptation. Now people can have salvation from their sins because Jesus, who never sinned, died on the cross for them.
- Jesus fasted and recited passages of Scripture when He was tempted. But He did not sin.
- . Christians should deal with temptations as Jesus did. They can fast, pray, and remember and quote Scripture.
