

## Bible, Lesson 19 review

- Peter and John healed a lame man through the power of Jesus and in His name.
- The Sanhedrin-Jewish rulers--were angry at Peter and John because they acted in Jesus' name. The Sanhedrin had Peter and John arrested and brought in for questioning.
- Peter spoke boldly when questioned. He announced that the Sanhedrin had rejected Jesus when they condemned Him to death but that God had raised Him to life.
- Peter declared that Jesus is the cornerstone. Salvation is through faith in Christ and Christ alone.
- Jesus told His followers that there are two gates that a person can enter-a wide or narrow one. These represent choices that people make regarding their relationship with God.
- The wide gate and broad way or road represent the easy choice to live life in a selfish manner.
- The narrow gate represents the choice to follow Jesus and live for Him.
- The narrow way or road can be hard at times, but it leads to eternal life in heaven.

All people are born with a sin nature. Jesus is the only one who could have atoned for the sins of people through His sacrifice on the cross.

- There is no salvation in anyone other than Jesus. No other religion or god can save. People are unable to save themselves from the consequences of sin.
- Jesus is the mediator between God and people. A mediator is someone who acts to restore a relationship between two parties. Because all people are sinners and God is holy, only Jesus, who is sinless, could have acted as a mediator between God and people. People can not be reconciled to God other means.
- Jesus Christ is true God and true Man.
- Jesus is the way, the Truth, and the Life.
