- Jesus appeared to many others and gave His followers instructions to be His witnesses to the ends of the earth.

Through Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, Jesus fulfilled many Old Testament prophecies.

After Jesus blessed His disciples, He ascended, or was taken up from the earth to heaven.
