Review the Bible truths from this lesson by covering the following:

- The message of the Bible has endured for thousands of years.
- Endure means to last, to remain, or to continue for an extended period of time.
- The Bible endures even though other writings do not.
- Eternal means everlasting and without end.
- God's Word is eternal because God is eternal. The Bible is also true and has been faithfully preserved down through the ages. Because God's Word endures, it can be trusted.
- To preserve God's Word, scribes carefully copied Scriptures by hand.
- Dedicated Christian translators have been working for hundreds of years to translate the Bible into many languages.
- Prophecy is defined as a message from God that tells people about a future event.
- Just as God's Word endures, the prophecies in the Bible also endure.
- Jesus proved that God's Word is true by fulfilling prophecies exactly as it said He would.
- A revelation is an act of making truth known.
- Jesus revealed Himself to be the Christ, or the Messiah, the expected Savior. Jesus also revealed Himself as the Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and the End.
- Many prophecies about Jesus have already been fulfilled; others will be fulfilled when He comes again to Earth.
- Christians can be confident that all the prophecies in the Bible will be fulfilled in God's perfect time.
- Just as God's Word is eternal, God Himself is eternal as the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- Christians have preserved God's Word because it reveals who He is and teaches about God's way of salvation. It also provides guidance for how God wants believers to live.
- The Bible is for all people for all time. Its message endures.
- The Karen people of Burma received the Bible with joy because God had prepared their hearts in advance to receive His Word.
